#### 2. Rock Garden

Rock Garden was set in KJCMT in November 2023. It is erected in the premises of Department of Geology and is maintained by them. Students and public have free access to this this. The Rock Garden display a variety of rocks, minerals and structures. Igneous rocks namely, Granite, Diorite, Basalt, Amygdaloidal Basalt and Anorthosite are displayed. Metamorphic rocks exhibited include Slate, Schist, Gneiss, Charnockite and Marble. Conglomerate, Sandstone, Shale, Fossilifeous limestone and Kanker limestone are included under the category of Sedimentary rocks. Other exhibits include Quartz and Orthoclase – minerals widespread in the Earth's crust, Graphite – an industrial mineral, Laterite – a versatile building stone found all over Kerala and Spheroidal weathering structure. Granite, Basalt, Gneiss, Sandstone, Slate and Marble are used as building stones, apart from laterite. The displayed specimens are collected by students from various locations in India, as part of their Geological Field Work.

The prime motive behind establishing the rock garden is to educate students and the public on a variety of rocks and minerals that nature has gifted us. The rock garden is designed to disseminate useful information through digital platform. All specimens have name boards with QR code affixed on it. This enable visitors to scan QR code and learn the properties and use of these minerals and rocks.

Rock Garden arouses curiosity in visitors to learn and understand more about variety of minerals and rocks. This in turn drives them to know more about nature and its bounty. This structure is a distinctive feature of KJCMT, facilitating visitors to know more about Earth and its resources and thus to be more nature friendly.
