15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The College encourage students to learn using multidisciplinary approach in order to broaden their knowledge base. This is mostly accomplished by: (i) Open Courses: During the fifth semester of undergraduate programs, Open courses are offered by the teaching departments of English, Commerce, Business Administration, Psychology, and Computer Applications. Students in the fifth semester of any program can opt to enroll in any of these courses that these departments offer. This enhances their knowledge base by acquiring greater understanding and appreciation of various disciplines. (ii) Add-on Courses: Add-on Courses offered by certain faculty members are interdisciplinary in nature. Department of English offered Add-on Courses in Soft skills and Communicative English, Professional Etiquettes and Soft Skills, and Conversational English for Career to students from other disciplines. Such courses guarantee an interdisciplinary approach for study by enhancing cognitive skills and critical thinking. (iii) Soft skill Programmes: Soft skill programmes that enhance capacity building of students in fields namely, computer skills,

language proficiency, character building, and health education, including yoga, are of an interdisciplinary nature. Soft skill training programmes provide a variety of benefits that contribute to personal development and career advancement. On implementation of NEP and Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP), several other multidisciplinary courses can be offered by the institution in the coming academic years

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is an integral part of National Education Policy. KJCMT follows the curriculum stipulated by Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, Kerala. Therefore, college has limited academic flexibility. The University has initiated implementation of FYUGP under NEP from next academic year. Subsequently, students will be enrolled to the ABC. However, students have been given awareness on ABC as a platform that fosters a student-centered approach in higher education, promoting accessibility and personal development

17.Skill development:

KJCMT conducted skill development sessions with the aim to enhance practical skills thereby fostering personal growth. Such programmes benefit students by enabling them to face challenges in their studies and future careers. Disciplines of skill development include soft skills, life skills, ICT skills, language skills, competitive training, and entrepreneurship. All teaching departments have conducted these programmes.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Incorporation of the Indian Knowledge System in education involves an approach that respects Indian languages, customs, and knowledge. It can promote a greater awareness of cultural heritage and its current significance among students and encourage them to respect and uphold the cultural heritage. KJCMT conducted several curricular and extracurricular activities designed to integrate Indian knowledge system. Hindi or Malayalam language is to be opted as a Common Course in all UG programmes. The college commemorates 'Hindi Divas,' National Hindi Day, and 'Vayanadinam' (Reading Day) to promote these languages. Seminars, intercollegiate and interdepartmental competitions are also conducted as part of this. Competitions namely, essay writing, poetry writing, elocution, and recitation as part of 'Arts Day' enhance command over these languages. Celebrations namely, 'Kerala Piravi,' 'Chinga Nilavu,' and 'Orumayude Oronam' are celebrated in order to uphold Kerala's rich cultural legacy. Students are encouraged to practice yoga as an integral part of Indian culture for which regular yoga sessions and demonstration classes are held. Ethnic Day is celebrated to showcase traditional arts and cultural heritage.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

OBE emphasises a student-centric teaching-learning process. It focuses on specific, measurable outcomes that students are expected to achieve by the end of a course or program. These outcomes are mapped to show whether all the courses attain the desired goals, aims, and objectives. KJCMT follows the 3 tier system of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) namely, Programme Outcome (PO), Programme Specific Outcome (PSO), and Course Outcome (CO) for all UG and PG programmes. For the current academic year, the College followed OBE within its restricted academic flexibility which will be switched onto a more precise approach by the implementation of NEP in the upcoming academic years.

20.Distance education/online education:

Distance education/online education has become a common mode of learning after the Covid pandemic. Several digital platforms, namely, Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Meet, and Webex, were used for efficient academic transactions such as classes, assignments, and seminar submissions. Furthermore, a number of invited lectures and webinars were conducted through these platforms. Digital platforms are being used to share notes, study materials, and PowerPoints with students. Moreover, competitions for students were also conducted over digital platforms. The college has active local chapters of SWAYAM-NPTEL and Coursera that encourage students and faculty members to attend online certification courses. In the third year of the program, all UG students undertake virtual classes and examinations for the MOOC course on Organic Farming. Additionally, faculty members attend webinars and Faculty Development Programmes through digital platforms.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college has developed a teaching-learning strategy that integrates the curriculum provided by Mahatma Gandhi University with the college's vision and mission. College prepares an

academic calender outlining academic events in line with academic schedule published by the university. The institution follows the CBCS curriculum of MG University of 2017 for UG and 2019 for PG Programs. The college adheres to the syllabus prescribed by the University and schedules internal examinations and model examinations in each semester. The college follows an outcome based education for various programmes and courses.

Orientation programs for first-year students, classical lecture systems along with innovative teaching methods, mentor support programs, counseling facilities and the use of ICT platforms by faculty members enhance the curriculum delivery. Internships, educational tours and projects are part of curriculum. Remedial classes and peer teaching sessions are conducted to support slow learners. Students are encouraged to enroll in Add on courses as well as NPTEL and Coursera Campus Programs to enhance their knowledge base. Monthly departmental meetings and yearly reports are used to monitor and assess the curriculum's implementation. Feedback on the curriculum collected from stakeholders is communicated to the Academic Council and Governing Body for necessary follow-up.

<p>The college has a well administered Continuous Internal Evaluation System at the institution level, which records, publishes, and maintains the assessment data in addition to evaluating students' academic performance through regular and consistent analytical processes.</p>	

An Internal Examination Committee is set up which administer all the internal, model as well as university examinations. The college establishes circulates a list of instructors' for the invigilation duties and publishes the seating arrangements for students well in advance. The internal and model examinations will be administered twice a semester. The faculty members are instructed to submit their question papers in the specified format. In all the examination halls CCTV s are set up to guarantee that tests are administered fairly. And after the conduct of all the examinations the students receive evaluated answer scripts in a time-bound manner.

All the students must create an authentic and unique report for seminars and assignments which will account for the internal evaluation. While evaluating the seminar classroom management, subject expertise, language delivery, and content quality etc will be considered. The assignments may be due once or twice in a semester.

All academic facilities of the college are housed in two blocks which includes 6 staff rooms, 2 non-teaching staffrooms, 41 ICT Enabled Classrooms , 4 Multipurpose Seminar Halls ,open areas and common areas. KJCMT has a clear organizational structure that follows the rules of its governing body and affiliating university, staying true to its vision and mission. It adopts a structured and decentralized approach to implement policies and procedures related to academic and administrative matters.

The institution creates its Strategic/Perspective Plan with input from all stakeholders. At the beginning of each academic year, a clear action plan is prepared to support the overall development. The plan is based on SWOC analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Challenges), helping the institution to identify last year’s shortcomings.

Under the Strategic Plan 2018–2023, KJCMT achieved several goals, including NAAC Accreditation with a CGPA of 3.17, starting M.Sc. Psychology, M.A. HRM, B.Sc. Cyber Forensic and an additional BCA batch. The college signed MoUs for research, conducted 41 Add on Courses, and hosted 191 seminars and 30 Faculty Development Programs. Faculty published 91 papers, and classrooms were fully equipped with ICT and Wi-Fi. Key audits, including Academic, Administrative, and Green Audits, were conducted. Upgrades included a 120.5 KW solar power plant, TCS ERP software, and an electronic library register. The college partnered with Kerala C-APT, provided free education to a top-performing student, appointed a counsellor, and earned ISO Certification.

The institution follows a Performance-Based Appraisal System (PBAS) to assess the performance of both teaching and non-teaching staff. At the end of each academic year, teaching staff must complete a self-appraisal form outlining their contributions, such as teaching hours, co-curricular involvement, research activities, extension work, and other responsibilities. Institution maintains a clean and green campus. Solid waste includes left over materials of construction work, packing materials, plastic, paper and used sanitary pads. Among these, biodegradable items (paper, packing material) are shifted to waste disposal plant and are burnt in incinerator located close to Kristu Jyoti Auditorium. A user friendly, electrically operated incinerator is installed in each lady's washroom. The college has entered into an agreement with MSH-E Waste Collection, Erattupetta to collect other solid waste and E-waste.

Bulk of food waste comes from left-over food from students and staff which are deposited in buckets kept in washrooms. Food waste that can be used as food for fish is dumped into a pond where fish is reared. Other food wastes go to waste disposal plant.

College generates very little quantity of chemical waste in chemical laboratory and all acids are used with at least 1:1 dilution. Therefore, chemical waste is washed down the drain. Sewage water coming from wash basins are drained down through pipes to sink pits. Toilet waste of the entire building complex is accommodated in three septic tanks within the campus.

7.2.1 - Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual.

Best practice - I EMPOWERMENT THROUGH EDUCATION AND MEDICAID FOR NEEDY

Objective: To provide financial aid for low-income dialysis patients and sponsor orphaned children's education.

Context: Kristu Jyoti College students initiated "Empowering Futures," supporting SOS Children's Village, Cochin, and the Harsham Project at St. Thomas Hospital for dialysis patients, with contributions from alumni, faculty, and students

Practice: Funds are collected from students, faculty, and management. Rs. 5,170 is spent monthly on dialysis, while Rs. 56,400 annually supports two orphaned children.

Evidence of Success: Launched in June 2023, it sponsors two children and donates Rs. 5,000 monthly for dialysis. The initiative has run successfully for six years.

Challenges: Establishing transparency, fundraising, and effective coordination required meticulous planning and volunteer support.

Best Practice II: KRISTUJYOTIAN INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURIAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

Objective: The initiative fosters entrepreneurial mindsets, innovation, and self-reliance through student projects, workshops on technology-driven entrepreneurship, nanodegree certifications, and building a collaborative innovator community.

Context: Inovus Labs at Kristu Jyoti College, recognized by the Kerala Start-up Mission as an Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Center, is a student-driven hub promoting innovation, and skill development for wealth creation and technological excellence.

Practice: Inovus Labs funds student projects like a buggy car, encourages entrepreneurial efforts, and provides an IoT Work Lab with advanced tools for hands-on, industry-aligned learning.

Challenges: Overcame limited awareness, technical expertise gaps, and infrastructure issues through training, resources, and management-funded support.
